When Glory and Joe Vigil formally adopted Juniper, she was convinced that moving out of state and changing her name would release her from the grief of her sister's disappearance. She thrived in the anonymity that came with their move from California, where her tragic family history would always define her as "the sister of Casey McGuire, the girl who never came home."

Eight years after Casey's disappearance the case is considered cold. While her body was never found, she is believed to be dead, though ten years will have to pass before the courts can legally declare it. Juniper agrees this is the most logical outcome, but a part of her heart still holds out hope. And when a college course takes her to a pueblo just a few hours from home, she discovers this hope is not unfounded.
